Nitrox Diver Certification

Course Overview

This course is a continuing education course for certified scuba divers who are at least 15 years old. It is an enjoyable instructor supervised program of instruction conducted in both the classroom and the open water setting. This course is designed to introduce scuba divers to the benefits of diving with oxygen-enriched air. When the "best mix" is used you can usually double your allowable bottom time if you have the available volume. Nitrox use should be the rule instead of the exception.

This is a great course to take in conjunction with the Basic or Advanced course.

Price includes: lectures, instructor fees and certification card. **Price does not include:** Dive fees ((\$65/Boat (see note)), books, equipment (scuba cylinder w/Nitrox, regulator, buoyancy compensator, dive instruments to include compass) or your basic equipment (mask, fins, snorkel, weight belt w/weights, dive bag and exposure suit), travel expenses, lodging or meals.

Course Curriculum

- **Class:** Wednesday (6pm-10pm): Chapters 1 through 7 and the examination. **Knowledge reviews must be completed prior to class.**
- **Dives:** Saturday afternoon or Sunday morning. Two-tank ocean dive in Boynton Beach w/"Loggerhead" dive charters.

Note: We use the NAUI education system for this course. There are two types of cards you can get from NAUI. One is a NITROX" card and it is given when you do not conduct two open water dives during the course. The other is a NITROX DIVER" card and it is awarded when you do conduct two open water dives during the course. Both cards enable you to dive with NITROX. If your medical condition has changed since your initial certification you need to inform your doctor that you intend to resume scuba diving. You will need to come in and pick up your books as soon as possible because there is homework that must be completed prior to class.
